Note: City Sanitation plan is an integrated and holistic planning process which will take into account the entire cycle of sanitation - safe access, collection, treatment and disposal, with a special focus on the un-served and poor. Plans will be developed such as to ensure 100% sustainability and cost recovery.

## **STEPS INITIATED SO FAR.....**

- **Draft State Urban Sanitation Strategy prepared in line with the Government of India's NUSP – 2008. To be finalised soon along with constitution of an Inter Departmental Sanitation Committee.**
- **Constitution of State Level Steering Committee at the state level and City Sanitation Committee/Cell at each city level under process.**
- **National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA), New Delhi has been engaged as the Technical Coordinator to anchor preparation of City Sanitation Plans .**
- **8 selected cities/towns for preparing the CSPs have been categorised into following three groups:**
  - **Bhubaneswar and Puri;**
  - **Cuttack, Balasore and Baripada; and**
  - **Sambalpur, Rourkela and Berhampur.**
- **Eleven firms have been short listed and RFP have been issued.**
- **Contract to be finalised by September, 2010**



## **VISION FOR CSP**

**All cities and towns become totally clean, sanitized, healthy, liveable, and to ensure and sustain good public health and environmental outcomes for all citizens with a special focus on hygienic and affordable sanitation for the urban poor and women.**

Adequate availability and satisfactory upkeep of public/common</li> </ul>	<b>0-3 yrs.</b>
<b>Medium Term</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Sanitary and safe disposal of human excreta and liquid waste from all sanitation facilities in urban areas.</li> <li>❖ Establish appropriate systems of operations and maintenance of the disposal system, ensuring financial sustainability or adequate financial flows to operate system unhindered.</li> <li>❖ Establish appropriate system of operation and maintenance for individual, community and public latrines through sustained communication and motivation for behaviour change, proper usage, regular upkeep and maintenance by community or designated agency.</li> <li>❖ Develop comprehensive institutional arrangements at ULB levels by re-orienting institutions responsible for sanitation provision with appropriate management systems.</li> </ul>	<b>3-10 yrs.</b>
<b>Long term</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ Planned sanitation management Infrastructure should be fully functional in each city and systems in place to manage additional households through then existing mechanisms.</li> </ul>	<b>10-20 yrs.</b>

## **SUSTAINABILITY PLAN ..... COST RECOVERY?**

**Cost will be recovered by means of introduction of user charges for sewerage connection and solid waste collection.**

## **CHALLENGES/ CAPACITY NEEDS OF ULB**

- **Department and para-statal currently carrying out these responsibilities will provide support to ULBs to ensure that ULBs implement these functions effectively.**
- **Capacity building programs need to be initiated for creating awareness both among officials and elected representatives.**
- **State to facilitate formulation of regulatory provisions.**
- **MoUD to provide financial and capacity building support.**
