# Section 4: Description and Definition of Success Indicators and Proposed Measurement Methodology

- JNNURM was launched in December, 2005. The Mission period is 2005-12. A Mission target of 15 lac houses was fixed based on the funds allocation. No annual target was fixed. The focus in the year 2005-06 to 2008-09 was on sanction of as many houses as possible so that these may be completed by year 2012. Focus has shifted to monitoring the progress of already sanctioned project and release of subsequent installment for them. That is the reason why the number of new houses have gone down in current year.
- Since the sanction of new houses has reached a saturation level therefore the focus this year is on the monitoring for successful completion of these projects. Therefore, RFD (2010-11) proposed a reduction in the target indicators from 76000 in 2009-10 to 30000 in 2010-11.
- The Ministry will identify the total number of nonstarter projects as on 31.3.2010 against which reviews are to be made and advisories issued in 2010 11.
- Similarly in the initial years, the focus was on building Capacity to prepare DPRs etc and a large number of Capacity building programmes were conducted.
- The National Policy on Urban Street Vendors was revised in 2009 to make it more attuned to the existing urban scenario and facilitate the hawkers and vendors in earning dignified living without undue harassment. The Policy and the Model Law has been circulated to the States for adoption of the Policy and provide a legal framework for street vending. The Ministry has adopted the strategy of advocacy through orientation workshops and consultation and persuade the States to draw a plan of action for implementing the Street Vendor Policy in their States and also formulate a legal framework in line with the Model Law circulated by this Ministry.
- ISHUP is a demand driven scheme. Additional housing stock of 3.1 lakh houses for EWS/LIG segments over the next three years (2009-12) is likely to be created through this scheme.
- Under ILCS, funds are provided by this Ministry through the State Governments for the conversion of dry latrines into sanitary latrines. However, rehabilitation of manual scavengers is not the subject matter of this Ministry. Rehabilitation of manual scavengers is looked after by M/o Social Justice and Empowerment.
