



Monthly summary on the principal activities of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs for the month of April, 2022

I. Swachh Bharat Mission

- i. 4,371 cities/ towns have been declared as ODF (Open Defecation Free) of which 4,317 cities have been certified through third party verification, 3,354 cities have been certified as ODF+, 964 cities have been certified as ODF++ and 9 cities have been certified as Water+.
- ii. 67,407 toilets across more than 3,326 cities are live on Google Maps with the name of "SBM Toilet".
- iii. Swachhata App emerged as an important tool towards enabling citizens to have their grievances addressed by the concerned Municipal Corporation. The revised version enables citizens to get their COVID-related complaints also redressed by their respective ULBs. The Swachhata App has a total of 1.99 crore users, who have posted 2.52 crore complaints, of which 2.36 crore complaints have been resolved, with a resolution of above 94%.
- iv. The Secretary (HUA), Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs launched the 'National Behaviour Change Communication Framework for Garbage Free Cities' under Swachh Bharat Mission (2.0) on 29th April 2022 to strengthen the ongoing *Jan Andolan for 'Garbage Free Cities'*. The Behaviour Change Communication (BCC) Framework focuses on intensifying messaging around the key focus areas of source segregation, collection, transportation, and processing of waste, plastic waste management, and remediation of legacy dumpsites to truly transform the urban landscape of India.
- v. On 29th April 2022, SBM-Urban Mission directorate of MOHUA organized the second episode of "SwachhTalks" as part of its peer-learning webinar series for States/UTs and ULBs, with the theme "Swachhata ki Jyot". The objective of the webinar was aimed at sharing field experiences and best communications practices of sector partners, cities, and States in making an impact in the field of Swachhata. The webinar also saw presentations made by two states (Chhattisgarh and Odisha), two ULBs (Lonavala and Vijaywada) and two Sector partners (BBC Media Action and Cure) with participation from state and ULB officials and sector partners.

II. Smart Cities Mission (SCM)

- i. During the month 19 projects worth ₹ 1,381 crore have been completed and work has been started on 2 projects worth ₹ 15 crore. So far 7,894 projects worth ₹1,92,103 crore have been tendered, work orders have been issued for 7,697 projects worth ₹ 1,82,221 crore out of which 3,863 projects worth ₹ 63,141 crore have been completed.

- ii. A series of events were organized in pursuance of the clarion call given by Hon'ble Prime Minister to commemorate 75th anniversary of India's Independence as Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM). The Conference Smart Cities, Smart Urbanization organized during 18-20 April, 2022 at Surat portends to be a watershed event - a confluence of ideas, innovations and partnerships to inform the future trajectory of smart urban development in India.

III. Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT)

- i. State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs) have been finalized for all the states for ₹77,640 crore. As on date, Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) have been approved for the projects costing ₹82,344 crore. Some States have taken up projects in excess of their approved SAAPs. Entire excess amount in such cases will be borne by the States/ULBs. Works have been completed for 4,259 projects worth ₹27,743 crore and work is in progress for 1,596 projects worth ₹53,874 crore. In all, physical work worth about ₹61,225 crore has been carried out in completed/ongoing AMRUT projects implying that around 80% of physical work has been completed.
- ii. So far, ₹37,496 crore has been released to States/UTs towards project implementation (including the eligible projects of erstwhile JnNURM), Administrative & Office Expenses (A&OE), reform incentive, and under sub-schemes on 'Formulation of GIS based Master Plans in AMRUT cities' and 'Local Area Plan (LAP) and Town Planning Schemes (TPS)' in 25 selected cities.

IV. Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana /National Urban Livelihood Mission (DAY/NULM)

- i. 2,682 Self Help Groups (SHGs) have been formed; 3,752 SHGs were given Revolving Fund; 7,308 candidates were skill trained and certified; 465 trained candidates were given placement; 1,383 beneficiaries were assisted with loans for setting up of individual and micro enterprises and 1,139 loans were given to SHGs under SHG-Bank linkage programme.
- ii. Under PM Street Vendor's AtmaNirbhar Nidhi (PMSVANidhi), 45,93,869 applications have been received against which 34,39,811 sanctions and 31,66,860 disbursements have been made.
- iii. Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs in the meeting held on 27.04.2022 approved the proposal for continuation of PM SVANidhi scheme beyond March, 2022.

V. Pradan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY)/Housing for All (HFA)

- i. Since the inception, Mission has sanctioned 1.23 crore houses of which 98.36 lakh houses have been grounded for construction of which 58.68 lakh houses have been completed/delivered.

VI. Housing.

- i. All States/ UTs have notified rules under RERA except Nagaland, which is under process to notify the rules.
- ii. 31 States/UTs have set up Real Estate Regulatory Authority (Regular - 25, Interim - 06). Ladakh, Meghalaya, Sikkim & West Bengal have notified the rules while yet to establish authority.
- iii. 28 States/UTs have set up Real Estate Appellate Tribunal (Regular -24, Interim – 04).
- iv. Regulatory Authorities of 28 States/UTs have operationalized their websites under the provisions of RERA.
- v. So far, 90,610 complaints (including 2,977 complaints during the month) have been disposed of by the Real Estate Regulatory Authorities across the country
- vi. So far, 80,290 projects and 62,462 agents have been registered under RERA. 2,065 projects and 911 agents have been registered during the month.
