Summary of important policy decisions/ events pertaining to the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs during the month of March, 2024

- 1. Achievements of Ministry of Housing & Urban affairs in Financial Year 2023-24 are as under:
 - Capital Expenditure: Rs. 26,441.40 Crore
 - Revenue expenditure: Rs. 42,355.21 Crore
 - Constructed 76 thousand individual household latrine units (IHHL) under Swachh Bharat Mission- Urban (SBU-U). Out of around 25 Crore MT of legacy waste, 9.57 Crore MT (38%) is remediated.
 - Under Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) 50 lakhs functional water tap connections and 42 lakh sewer connections which includes households coverage under septage management have been provided across all States/ UTs during the period. "Online Building Permission System" has been made operational in 1,134 towns/ cities overall.
 - Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana / National Urban Livelihood Mission (DAY/ NULM) has created 1,06,631 SHGs. 60,066 SHGs were given Revolving Fund, 98,362 beneficiaries were assisted with loans for setting up of individual and micro enterprises and 1,09,746 number of loans were given to SHGs under bank linkage programme.
 - In the Housing sector, 22,133 Real Estate Projects and 114,304 Real Estate Agents were registered
 - Under PM Street Vendor's Atma Nirbhar Nidhi (PMSVANidhi), 41.06 lakh loans disbursed to 28.94 lakh new beneficiaries amounting to Rs. 6,045 Crore.

2. Performance/ Highlights during the month of March, 2024 is given below:

I Smart City Mission

177 projects worth Rs.6,922 crore were completed during the month.

Shimla Smart City has spearheaded a project worth Rs. 66.81 crores on 15.03.2024 in partnership with engineering specialists from IIT Roorkee and Himachal Pradesh Public Works Department (HPPWD), aimed at stabilizing and reviving the significant area located between the Heritage Town Hall and the Padam Dev Market.

Chandigarh Smart City have initiated the development of a Zero Waste Modern Food Street in Sector 15, Chandigarh on 14.03.2024, as part of efforts towards sustainable development.

II Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT)

AMRUT

- i. 32 projects worth Rs. 561 crore got completed during the month.
- ii. Total works worth Rs. 549 crore were executed in the month.

- i. Detailed Project Reports (DPR) approved for 483 projects costing Rs. 2,600 core.

III. Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana / National Urban Livelihood Mission (DAY/ NULM)

During the month 13,001 Self Help Groups (SHGs) were formed. 11,974 SHGs were given Revolving Fund. 14,074 beneficiaries were assisted with loans for setting up of individual and micro enterprises and 18,596 numbers of loans were given to SHGs under SHG-Bank linkage programme.

IV. PM Street Vendor's Atma Nirbhar Nidhi (PMSVANidhi)

- i. Under PM SVANidhi, 1,06,63,248 applications were received against which 87,94,012 sanctions and 84,14,932 disbursals have been made.
- ii. Rs. 100.50 crore have been released under the mission during the month of March, 2024.

V. Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY)/ Housing for All (HFA)

- i. Since the inception, Mission has sanctioned 1.19 crore houses of which 114.01 lakh houses have been grounded for construction of which 82.02 lakh houses have been completed/ delivered.
- ii. Rs. 5,440.92 crore were released during the month taking cumulative to Rs.1,63,926 crore since inception i.e., June 2015.
